


Cape Farewell brings artists, scientists and educators together to address and raise awareness about climate change. Created by David Buckland, Cape Farewell has led three expeditions into the wild, beautiful and icy High Arctic, a place for artistic inspiration and scientific enquiry. In September 2007 Cape Farewell launches two further voyages to the Arctic, taking an international group of young people, artists and scientists to Svalbard, Greenland and Iceland. In 2008 the Barbican Art Gallery will tour the critically acclaimed exhibition, *Cape Farewell: Art & Climate Change* internationally and in partnership with the British Council, Cape Farewell is building a range of artistic collaborations worldwide. From August 2007 Cape Farewell will be based at the newly re-opened Southbank Centre and in 2007/08 the Southbank and Eden Project will be Cape Farewell's major project partners.
